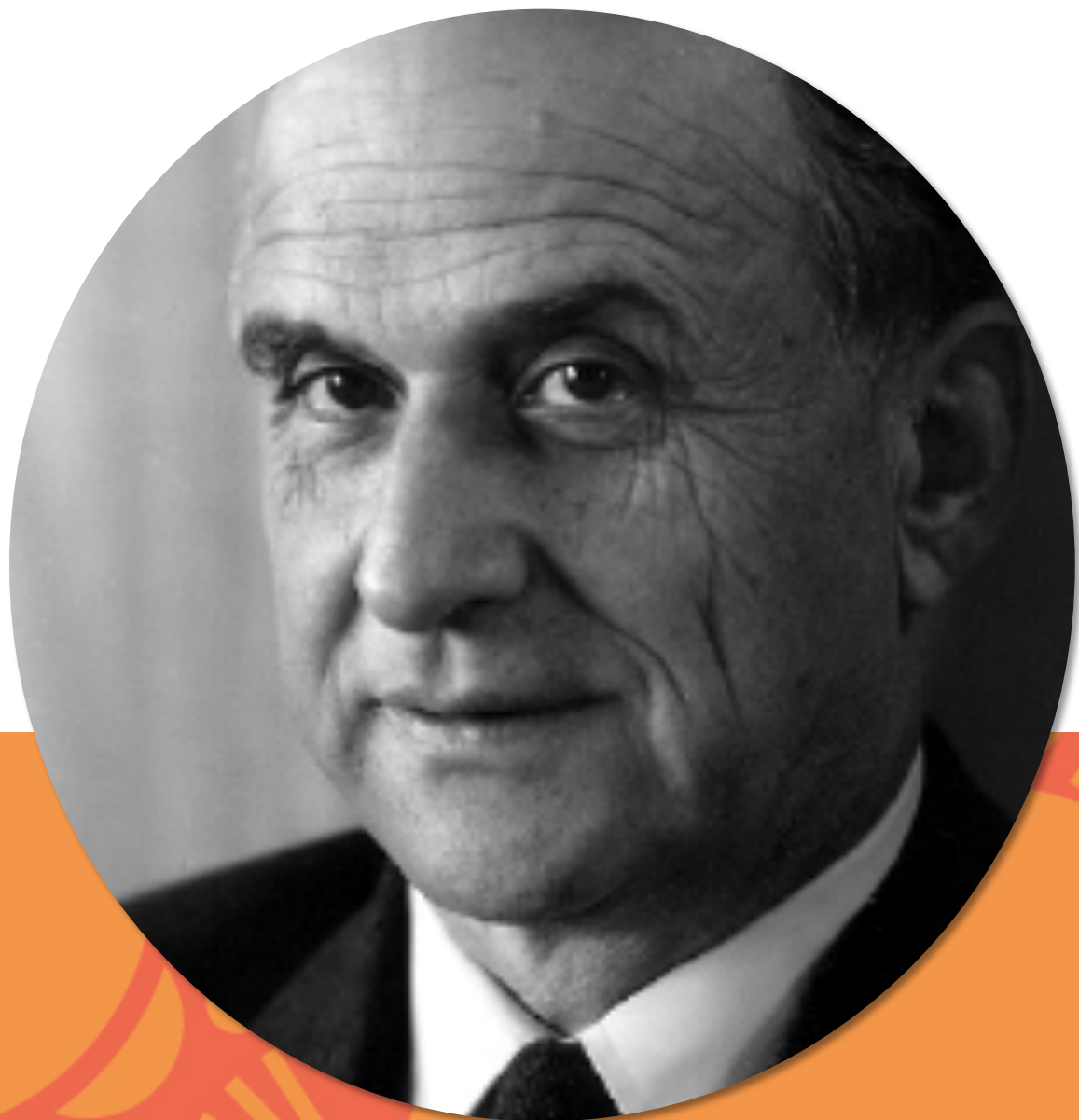

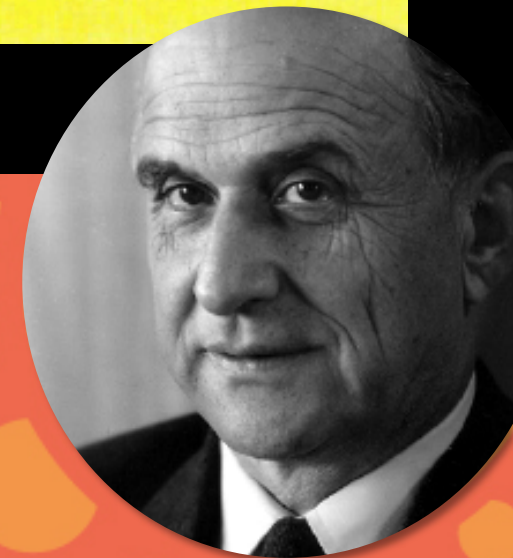

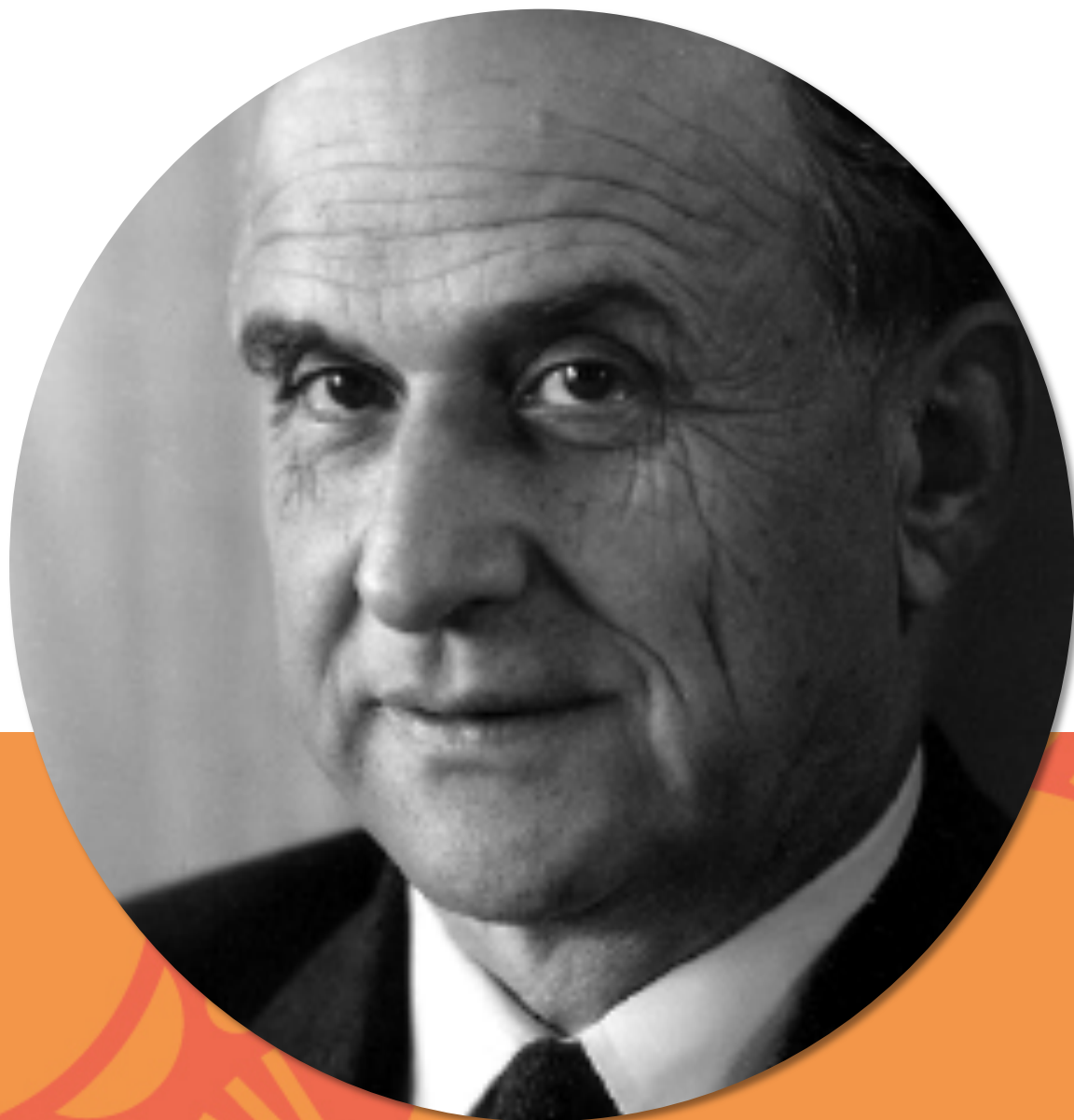
Memorandum to: All staff members - Project 0
