Figure Me Out Identity Web

Playful Learning Activity Card

Purpose

To learn about your learners and their funds of knowledge, and to support learners to learn more about each other

Process

- As homework, ask each student to create a web that includes whatever information about themselves the student wants to share. This could include any of the following aspects of identity or more that you and your students come up with:
 - ¬ Race, language, gender, ability identity
 - ∀ Family
 - ∇ Professional identities
 - □ Interests, play activities, and hobbies
 - Skills and talents
- The webs can be created by hand on paper or digitally and include only words, or words and pictures
- Before class, have students cover up their names at the center of the web with a post-it or small piece of paper
- Post the webs around the classroom. Or, if you have a very large class, have students gather in small groups and mix up their webs on the table in front of them
- Working either as a whole class or in small groups, try to figure out which web belongs to each person in the class. Once you have ideas about who is who, lift the post-it notes to reveal the names
- Invite students to share more about their identity and something that they learned about another student through this experience
